PACKING LIST

When preparing for your Long Lake Experience, keep in mind that appropriate clothing will make your visit to Long Lake more enjoyable and enriching. Here in the north woods, we are not concerned with fashion. We are concerned with practicality.

Warm outerwear is **essential** at all times of year. Weather at Long Lake can change rapidly, and even early autumn and late spring can be cold—especially in the evening.

Items should be labeled clearly with the student's name.

ALL SEASONS

- backpack, duffel bag, or suitcase
- sleeping bag or bedroll (2 sheets & blanket)
- pillow & pillow case
- socks, 4 pairs minimum, including long socks
- tennis shoes/sneakers
- pants, 2 pairs
- short-sleeved shirts, 2
- long-sleeved shirts, 2
- hat (baseball cap and stocking cap)
- toiletries:
 - ___ soap (for shower & hand-washing)
 - ___ bath towel
 - ___ hand towel
 - ___ washcloth
 - ___ toothbrush & toothpaste
 - ___ hair brush
 - ___ small drinking cup for use in the room.

SPRING AND FALL

- rubber boots (or old tennis shoes that can get wet and muddy)
- rain gear: poncho or rain suit (some stores sell these inexpensively)
- warm jacket
- insect repellent

WINTER (mid-October through early May)

- long johns/warm underclothing, 2 pair
- sweater
- warm shirts
- warm parka/winter coat
- ski pants or snowmobile suit
- mittens, 2 or 3 pairs
- lining gloves
- warm socks, 2 pairs—wool or winter socks
- warm boots that fit well, preferably with removable liners
(Remember, tight boots will cause cold feet!)
- scarf
- warm hat

EXTRAS (bring if desired)

- camera and film (please label cameras)
- binoculars

DO NOT BRING

- weapons of any sort are NOT allowed
- flashlights
- radios or cd players
- gum (harmful to animals that may eat it from the ground)
- beverages, candy, other food items
- knives or cutting tools
- hair dryers, curling irons
- electronic games or hand-held computers
- cell phones or pagers
- body sprays and cologne
- aerosol based toiletries
